APPEAL WITHDRAWN FOR LEE COUNTY MEDICAL CENTER CERTIFICATE OF NEED

LEESBURG, Ga. (April 20, 2018) – Today, Lee County Medical Center (LCMC) leaders announced that Crisp Regional Hospital has withdrawn its appeal of the November 15, 2017 decision of the Georgia Department of Community Health to grant LCMC a Certificate of Need (CON) to establish a sixty (60) bed short-stay general hospital in Lee County.
